Crime Severity Index (CSI)

CSI tracks the severity of reported crime in a jurisdiction. It tracks both the *amount* of crime as well as the *seriousness* of the crimes reported. Areas with a population close to 5000 people or less must review the results with caution as the lower the population the more easily a CSI value can be influenced by offences that are more serious in nature. The top three serious offences in this jurisdiction were B&E, Theft under \$5000 and Fraud. Nine of the top ten were property crime offences.

- Olds Provincial Detachment: 2018 = CSI 102 2017 = 147 30% reduction
- Olds Municipal Detachment: 2018 = CSI 78 2017 = 110 29% reduction
- Overall CSI in Alberta was 112 in 2018 (an increase of 2% from 2017).
