POINTS OF INTEREST: Scammers typically are in a rush to close a deal, claim limited availability, take advantage of emotions. You should: exercise caution, slow things down, use common / spider sense, do your own research before you commit to anything. DON'T GIVE OUT ANY PERSONAL / FINANCIAL / CC INFORMATION. DON'T pre-pay for services. If it sounds too good – IT IS!! Only 5% of scams get reported. The Better Business Bureau AND Canadian Anti-Fraud organizations track reported scams. Also Scam Tracker. They are a good source to check information and if you do become a victim, report the scam to them and the local RCMP so others can be warned. TOP 10 SCAMS OF 2018: #10. BANK SCAM. #9.  - 4.1 Prov RCWA Report (Gerald) Phone APP under development SEE APPENDIX A FOR AGM REPORT. Report from Meeting March 21 22, 2019. We won the RCW Farmers' Advocate Award and \$1,000. It's for an innovative project that helps prevent and mitigate crime in rural communities. Gerald participated in Senate Review Committee hearing on Bill C-71. Info posted on our website. 53 Associations are now members of Prov RCW. Zone 2 (Central AB) has 50% of the members alone the #2 corridor.
 - 4.2 SUNDRE RCMP DIDSBURY RCMP OLDS RCMP REPORT:

Property crime is down across the Province . It spiked between 2012-2017 but decreasing 20-30% in 2018 due to Provincial RCMP measures like Provincial Intelligent Teams gathering and plotting criminal information by these dedicated teams working with local detachments who are working closely with community groups like RCW and COP. This has resulted in more public reports of suspicious behavior and the detachments thank the public for taking the time to call in reports. They are helping with arrests. Increased focus on working with community groups and concentrating on prolific offenders is paying off. Also, created public facing crime maps which are re-freshed every 2 weeks and posted on websites like the Olds RCW. Be suspicious of social media posts – there are a lot of untruths posted.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS:

- 1. Walk around your property and look at it like a thief would. Good Lighting / Alarms #1 tip.
- 2. Get together as a community and get to know your neighbors. Build community relations.
- 3. Put valuables in discrete, uncommon areas Not your bedroom or freezer.
- 4. Don't post on social media when you'll be gone. Post pics when you get back.
- 5. Don't have message on answering machine say you are gone.
- 6. Record serial numbers and/or pictures and keep in secure place for recovery. Mark tools and other property with distinguishable mark.
- 7. Audio alarms are good as well as driveway alarms.
- 8. Keep your contact info up to date with your alarm company.
- 9. Have a trusted friend / neighbor look in your property if you are gone and even move stuff around. Give them the security company's info and vice versa.
- 10. Close driveway gates even if you are home. Don't create a pattern that you only close them if you are gone.
- 11. Cloning and re-vin ing vehicles has been happening in our region with higher value vehicles. Check with dealer to make sure VIN matches what you are buying and check with registries office to make sure no liens. Get copy of D.L. of seller.
- 12. ID theft a big deal. Arrested an individual in Blackfalds with a significant amount questionable ID. Check your bank and credit card statements for weird small purchases. REPORT. Police can't do anything if they don't know!! You can remain anonymous.
- 13. Report abandoned vehicles to county and report suspicious vehicles to RCMP.
- 14. Check your vehicle for a license plate AND THAT IT IS YOURS!
- 15. Put a distinguishing mark on cargo trailers, and equipment of all types for ID and return if stolen and recovered.
- 16. Get your wallet out and record / take picture of everything in it. Take out SIN, Birth Certificate and any other personal information you don't use on a regular basis, Record the info on the back of the cards as well. Then if it's lost / stolen, recovery won't be as difficult.
- 17. Take an extra minute and make sure your garage door closes and stays closed.
- 18. Use manual lock on vehicle, instead of remote.
- 19. Don't leave vehicles running to warm up with keys in it (being stolen even in the rural areas)
- 20. Report anything you think is 'suspicious", even if it seems minor. Information is used to build crime stats and flag hot spots.

Central Alberta Stolen Vehicles – on social media

CLONING OF VEHICLE IDENTITY also an issue.

ANTI-THEFT: license plate screws.

Check your plate every time you drive: Is there one AND Is it Yours?

Consider hostile landscaping in vulnerable areas (in front of windows) IE rose bushes
