#### 4. REPORTS:

- 4.1 Fish & Wildlife (Adam Mirus) N/A
- 4.2 RCMP-Olds (Cst. Lyle Korver). Relatively quiet. 4 members went to Fort Mac with 1 Sundre member and 2 Didsbury members. Lyle spent his time working with the tactile team and

doing door to door canvassing – taking inventory of people still there. Also manned check points and watching for opportunists vandalising / stealing property. Still ongoing on a rotating basis. They were evacuated out of 2 different camps as citizens from Fort Mac arrived. There were and will be more health issues with the environment as fridges/deep-freezers are disposed of.

4.3 RCMP -Sundre (Cst. Val Dennis) PRESENTATION: DRUG SAFETY Community Safety Net. Val gave a short overview of the program. Over 300 books were distributed in the community. And to Grade 5 – 8 students & High School teachers as a resource.

Crime in Sundre: Lots of hits in back country. Compressor station hit – stole computer and other miscellaneous stuff. Please keep a watch on your community AND REPORT when you see something that seems fishy. There are Hundreds of **safety apps** have been developed for mobile devices such as smart phones and tablet computers.

- SECRETARY'S REPORT: Continue to work with CATV1.ca on crime reports for news 4.7 from Didsbury-Sundre & Olds RCMP. Reports posted on our website. No word on grant from County to create a Crime Prevention Tip of the week for paper/radio/TV. No word back from MVC on expenditures for 2015 for 2016 grant Attended Cochrane RCW AGM, April 9. Rosemary Lindsay's report on Prov. RCW Symposium is posted on our website with her permission. Presentation from F & W and RCMP Liaison who is also the RCMP Sketch Artist for S AB. Also attended Raven RCW meeting Apr 14. Presentations on Crime Prevention and Personal Safety from RD County Protective Services. HINT: Walk around your property and view it like a thief would. Get together as a community and get to know your neighbors! Build community relations. Put valuables in discrete, uncommon area. Don't post message on answer machine that says you are away and don't post on Facebook until you return!! Record serial numbers and keep secure for recovery. Audible alarms are good. If on vacation have trusted neighbor or friend move stuff around in your yard and make new tracks. If you have driveway gates close them when you are home and gone so someone can't predict when you are gone. Give your contact info to friend and their info to security company. Make sure your contact info is up to date with your security company. Cloning and re-vin ing vehicles has been happening in our region with higher value vehicles. Check with dealer to make sure VIN matches what you are buying and check with registries to make sure no liens. Get copy of D.L. of seller. ID theft a big deal. Recently arrested an individual in Blackfalds with a significant amount questionable ID. Check your bank and credit card statements for weird - small purchases. REPORT. Police can't do anything if they don't know!! You can remain anonymous. Report abandoned vehicles to county and report suspicious vehicles to RCMP.

- 6.1 Fan-out System retirement? System is coming to the end of its life with new rules on spam e-mail. Will require a total re-write of program to comply with regulations. The Executive is researching alternatives. System is still useable for phone messages.
- 6.2 Dangerous Criminal Designation. The question was raised on if we should send a resolution to our Provincial Association to strengthen the rules on designation of dangerous criminals. This follows a recent ruling on Matthew de Grood for the stabbing deaths of 5 youths in Calgary and NCR ruling. The families are asking that NCR rulings come with a High-risk Offender designation as well. The consensus was that we should send a resolution in support of HRO designations in these circumstances to the Prov RCW Assoc this fall.
