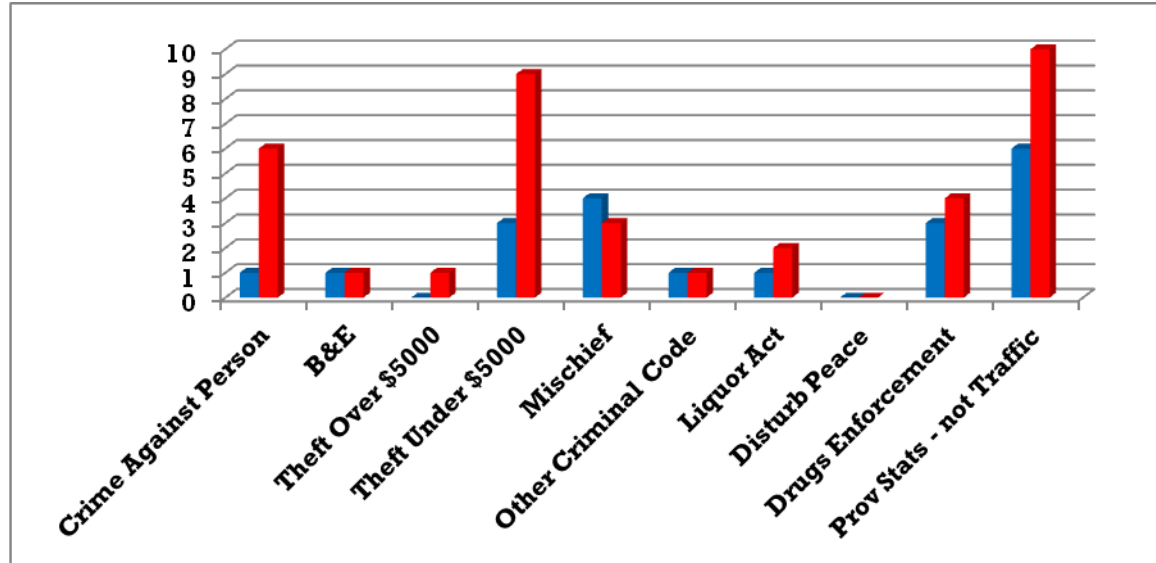
7.4 RCMP – Didsbury (Josianne Markley / Sheldon.Krasniuk) Mischief is up;

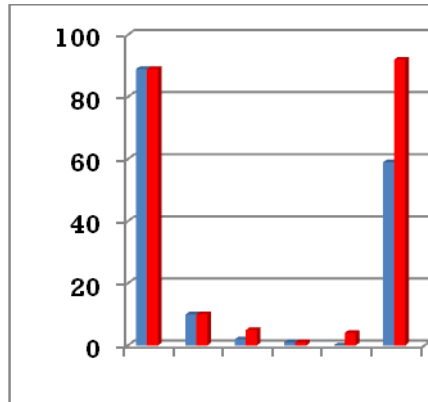

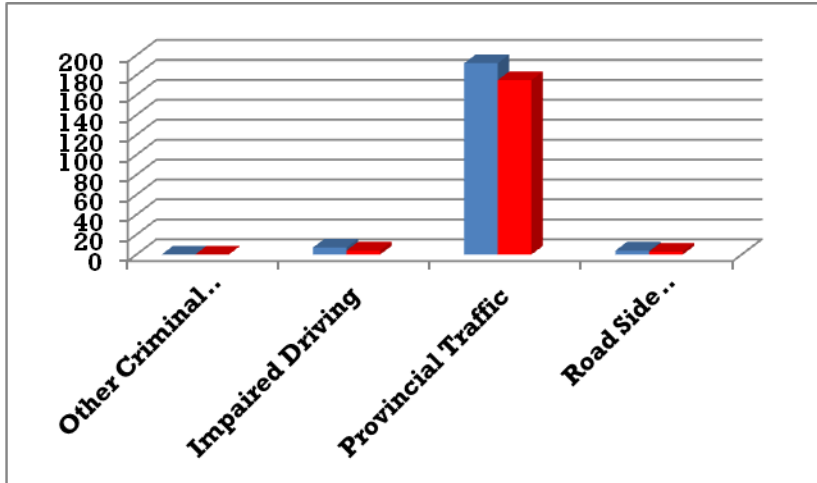

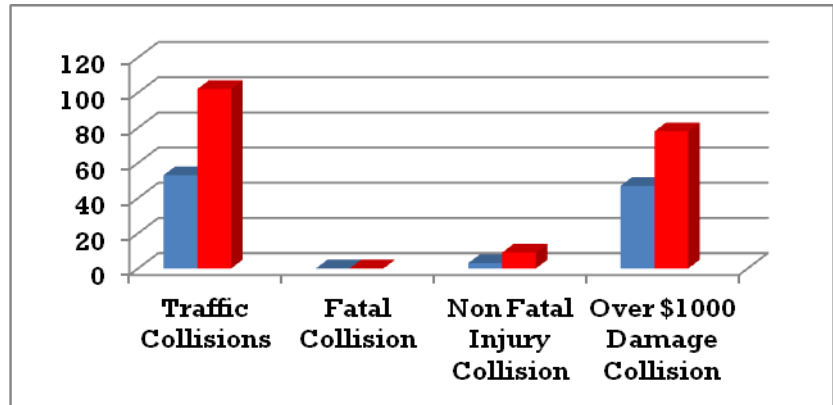

Narrative Report

1. Staffing issues are looking up. Cst. MacKenzie will be leaving us in the next quarter for Iqualit, NWT, Cst. Teed has departed on parenting leave, returning in November, Cpl. Byrt is likely to be taking parenting leave as well. We will be receiving Cst. Brendan Ward, from training in Depot, Cst. Keith Gaulton, from Vegreville, and Cpl Jay Peden, from Slave Lake. Overall things are relatively stable.
2. Members continue to be busy with motor vehicle collisions over the last quarter. The roads continue to supply surprises which include icy patches and snow drifts in places. The environment is masking the world in fog which adds to the hazards of driving and providing service to motorists.
3. Last quarter reporting reflects that most initiatives are on track to be completed successfully. It is now time to review the needs of the community for the 2011/2012 fiscal operating year. Ideas, concerns, both personal and that you have received from others are important in setting direction.
4. There continues to be a decrease in incidents over the last quarter, but again we have had a serious event that required a lot of resources. The Rexall Drug Robbery took extraordinary financial resources and dedication from our local members. When things began to fall into place we had 3 members put in an accumulated total of about 260 hrs work in less than 5 full days.
5. This year's APP planning is to take place over the next few months and input from the CAC is required for this purpose. Comments on the status of the programs from last year is not available due to systems issues.
