

## **Olds Detachment - Weekly Crime Report - 2015-Dec-18**

### **December 4, 2015**

Police attended the Co-Op Card Lock for a suspicious male who was reported to be physically sick near the gas pumps. Police attended and requested EMS attend. A 67 year old male was transported to hospital for cardiac concerns.

### **December 17, 2015**

On the morning of December 17th, 2015, Olds RCMP received several complaints of Mischief to vehicles primarily in the north west area of Olds. The victims reported that their windows had been smashed out of their vehicle and in some instances the contents had been rummaged through.

Investigation members secured samples of DNA evidence that have been sent to the forensic laboratory for analysis. The suspect(s) left other evidence behind that has also been seized.

The investigation is ongoing with no suspects identified at this time. Police are hopeful that the evidence obtained in this matter will lead to the person(s) responsible.

### **December 18, 2015**

Report of an intoxicated female who advised she was going to drive getting into her vehicle at Boston Pizza. Police attended to find the female had started her vehicle as police arrived. The driver was arrested and taken to the Olds Detachment to supply samples of her breath. Samples were over 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood.
