DELEGATION: Joe Gustafson, Chair of O-Net which is the wireless (fiber) network in town. – There is an opportunity to install security cameras around town at the Open Public Network Sites @ 30 sites to be created around town. As these are created there is an opportunity to install lines so that cameras can also be installed if the town wants to. There was considerable discussion on whether security cameras in any area of the community would be desirable or not. Policies would be developed on "who" looks at the data and what data is needed. Downtown, Skateboard Park, Ball Diamonds, streets around the bars, were all named as potential beneficial sites. The College Campus is looking at installing them in their parking lots to reduce incidents of vandalism to the vehicles. They are definitely a beneficial deterrent tool.

This will require pre-planning and research in to equipment – camera quality, night vision, storage of data, etc. Policies and experiences from other areas using these systems.

Time Frame – WiFi Downtown in next few months.

- l. **COMMERCIAL VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT (James Trombley)**
- We have increased our log haul inspections in the Sundre area, ensuring compliance with permit conditions and legislation.
 - School bus inspections have been conducted in our area and will continue until the end of the school year.
 - Recently we have dealt with slow moving vehicles on the highways (i.e. construction loaders/equipment, tractors, etc.) in the Olds area ensuring required equipment is displayed, lamps are functioning and applicable legislation is being followed. Good afternoon, Judy. Neither Fritz or myself will be in attendance as we will be in Calgary on College business for the day. Our regrets. I have however, composed a short report for your agenda: construction of the new Centennial Village proceeds on schedule and on budget. Shunda reports that a 'Show suite' will be ready shortly and available for viewing; by all accounts, the new Village is 'impressive.'. A new manager, Glenice Grover, is settling in place and is overseeing all aspects of the transition to the CHOC model. OC welcomes Glenice and her expertise as she transitions from Red Deer College. February was a fairly quiet month....the Eviction of 2 students from Residence for unruly and persistent misbehavior sent a strong message to the general student population. Alcohol violations were probably at an all-time low. Driving infractions were minimal, with 2 Warnings for 'stunting' being issued. RCMP intervention was required on 2 occasions, EMS were required once, all events requiring intervention were minor in nature. Two acts of Vandalism to vehicles, 1 Stolen Vehicle and 1 theft of a student's wallet were reported, however, the 'stolen' vehicle may have been simply misplaced. These incidents were referred to the RCMP. Increased patrols of the parking areas by both police and Security personnel seemed to have had the desired effect. We appreciate the work of RCMP members for their increased patrols. The Townhouses have been reasonably quiet, again due to increased presence.
