

Innisfail RCMP make an arrest of two men in connection with the attempted B & E of a rural property.

At approx 2:04 PM Innisfail RCMP responded to an alarm call at a rural property near Hwy 54 and RR 45 in Red Deer County. While enroute RCMP received another call from a witness who was near the property reporting suspicious activity. The witness did the right thing and stayed safe by calling police.



Police managed to get the owner of the property on the telephone who stated no one should be on their property at that time. Upon arrival Police observed a truck parked outside a garage with a male sitting inside. There were tracks entering the garage and upon the police entering the garage they found a second male inside. Both males were arrested without incident.

Sheldon Richard Metcalfe, 46, of Red Deer has been charged with break and enter. Metcalfe was released on a recognizance with conditions to appear in Red Deer Provincial court.

Lyle Stanton Dean Whitesel, 36, of no fixed address has been charged with break and enter, possession of break in tools, possession of methamphetamine, and breach of recognizance (two counts)

Whitsel has been remanded in custody to appear in court this month.
