

Airdrie RCMP Investigate American Counterfeit Currency

On December 4th, 2016, at approximately 2:30 p.m., two male suspects entered a grocery store in South West Airdrie and used counterfeit U.S. bank notes to purchase items from the store. They also bought gas from the gas station using the counterfeit money.

The suspects were driving a light Brown Dodge Caravan with a fish decal, which was mounted on the rear hatch of the van above the licence plate.

Police are looking for the public's help to identify the suspects. The first man described as:

- Caucasian male
- Short Brown hair
- Early to late 20s
- 5'8"-5'11" tall
- Wearing Black pants, White collar shirt with a tie, Black jacket

Second man is described as:

- Caucasian male
- Early to late 20s
- 5'8" - 5'11" tall
- Wearing Grey pants, White dress shirt with tie, Black leather jacket and Black baseball style hat.
