

## RCMP - Olds Detachment - Crime Report

April 1, 2016

RCMP conducted a search of a residence pursuant to a Search Warrant at 5129 52 Street, Olds, Alberta for stolen property. Police located items related to recent thefts in the area from RV's and Break and enters. The residence is familiar to Police who had conducted a search of the property on November 8, 2013 under similar circumstances and found thousands of dollars in stolen property.

Christopher Glysinskie, 50 years old, is charged with one count of Possession of stolen property under \$5000, Section 354(1)(a) of the Criminal Code.

A female located at the residence has been charged with two counts of Possessing a controlled substance (Marihuana and Methamphetamine) , Section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.

Michael Kelm, 39 years old, of Olds, AB was also in the residence and has been charged with two counts of Breach of his recognizance, Section 811 of the Criminal Code. Kelm was on release for Assault with a weapon allegations stemming from a domestic violence investigation in February. Kelm was remanded in custody.

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April 4, 2016

Police conducting patrols on Highway 2A about 6 km South of Bowden detected a motorbike doing 165 Kph in a 100 zone. The officer activated the police vehicles emergency equipment however the operator of the motorcycle did not stop. The bike was seen turning into a residential area at the south end of Bowden. Patrols were conducted to locate the motorcyclist. Local residents alerted police to having seen the offender and then advised they could hear the motorbike in the area. Police began an additional patrol when the motorbike exited a nearby alley and turned North toward the police vehicle. The motorcyclist attempted to go around the police vehicle but struck the driver side corner of the police vehicle at low speed. The operator of the motorcycle surrendered to police after running up over a curb, and riding into shrubbery causing the bike to tip over within approximately 16 metres of the police vehicle. No injuries were incurred by the motor cyclist. The police vehicle and motorbike sustained minor damages.

Continuing police investigation uncovered that the operator had 15 outstanding warrants for his arrest out of Wetaskiwin and Blackfalds Detachments. Additionally the plate on the bike was reported stolen.

Billyjack Williams, 43 years old, of No Fixed Address, Alberta has been charged with:  
Driving while disqualified, Section 259(4) of the Criminal Code;  
Dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, Section 249(1)(a) of the Criminal Code;  
Operate motor vehicle while pursued by police, Section 249.1(1) of the Criminal Code;  
Possession of stolen property, Section 354(1)(a) of the Criminal Code;  
Failing to comply with conditions of an Undertaking, Section 145(3) of the Criminal Code;  
Speeding, operate uninsured motor vehicle, operate vehicle not registered and display licence plate not authorized under the Traffic Safety Act; and  
Operate a motor vehicle without proof of ownership under the Operator Licensing and Vehicle Control Regulation.  
Mr. Williams remains in custody pending hearings in all jurisdictions for his release.

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April 4, 2016

At about 3:40 PM on Highway 27 a two vehicle collision was reported to police. A 2005 Chevy Venture was rear ended by a 2007 Mazda CX 7. The operator of the CX 7 reportedly was fatigued and ran into the car ahead then went into the ditch. Police caution motorists to not drive fatigued. If found driving fatigued motorists can be issued a 24 hour suspension Under Section 89 (1) of the Traffic Safety Act. It is estimated that about 20% of fatal collisions in Canada involve driver fatigue.

Drivers can consider doing the following to manage their fatigue:

- Sleep well prior to long road trips.
- Share the driving with other passengers.
- Take regular rest stops every couple of hours and do some exercise.
- When stopped, eat light meals or fruit throughout the journey.
- Drink plenty of water.
- If one feels tired during the trip, stopping to nap for twenty to forty minutes is an effective way of reducing sleepiness.

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April 5, 2016

UPDATE: Counterfeit American Currency

Olds RCMP have charged two subjects with Uttering counterfeit currency, Section 452(a) of the Criminal Code in relation to two of three instances that have occurred in Olds. The subjects have been charged in other RCMP and non RCMP jurisdictions.

Michael Zero, 32 years old, has been arrested and will be appearing at Provincial Court in Didsbury to speak to his release on April 11, 2016.

Jenna McArthur, 31 years old, has also been charged and a warrant for her arrest has been issued. McArthur has a history of this particular offence in Waterloo, Ontario in 2013.

BACKGROUND, March 8, 2016

Olds RCMP have received three complaints of counterfeit American twenty dollar bills since March 4. The suspects have been loud and have attempted to cause a scene in an effort to make the clerk uncomfortable and to compel them to accept the money.

Olds RCMP recommend that local businesses use diligence when handling American currency and educate themselves and staff in detecting counterfeit bank notes.

Businesses are not obligated to accept American currency for payment however do so as a courtesy to the customer. Alternatively businesses can direct the client to attend a bank to convert their money to Canadian currency.
