**Red Deer RCMP investigate shots fired in Deer Park**

At approximately 10:45 pm on March 31, Red Deer RCMP responded to a report of shots fired in the Deer Park neighbourhood. Police examination of a vehicle parked in a residential driveway on Denovan Crescent revealed two bullet holes and evidence that another bullet had ricocheted off its roof. RCMP investigators located another bullet in the soffit of a residence on the same crescent.

RCMP continue to conduct extensive interviews in the area and look for witnesses. At this point in the investigation, RCMP believe this was a targeted act. No one was injured during this incident and RCMP are not aware of any further property damage at this time.

**Crime Spree Leads to Several Criminal Charges for Young Offenders**

*Airdrie, Alberta-* On March 24, 2015, at 0324 a.m., Airdrie City RCMP responded to a glass break alarm at S&S Liquor store located in Airdrie, Alberta. Members arrived on scene and observed a 1999 Toyota Tercel running in front of the liquor store with two males inside the vehicle. When members attempted a traffic stop, the suspect vehicle fled from the scene. It was also noted the license plate had been reported stolen the previous day. While fleeing through the parking lot, the suspect vehicle hit the front of an RCMP member's marked police vehicle. Members pursued the vehicle to the Highway 27 entrance to Olds, Alberta, where Didsbury and Olds RCMP members assisted. The vehicle did not stop for police and the pursuit was terminated without any suspect arrested. The suspect vehicle was later found abandoned in Olds, Alberta. The earlier collision did not result in any injuries and minimal damage was sustained to the police vehicle.

On March 27, 2015, Airdrie RCMP Crime Reduction Unit, Airdrie RCMP General Investigative Section, Airdrie City and Airdrie Rural RCMP located the two youth suspect males involved in the above mentioned occurrence at the Crossfield Country Inn in Crossfield, Alberta. RCMP members observed the two youth males exiting a stolen vehicle from Didsbury, a 2005 Chrysler 300, who then entered the hotel. The two were arrested shortly after without incident for outstanding warrants out of Airdrie, as well as possession of stolen property.

Between the reported incident dates of March 24, 2015, and March 27, 2015, the same youth males have been charged with numerous crimes stemming from multiple jurisdictions in Southern Alberta including Airdrie, Calgary, Red Deer, Olds and Didsbury.

Charges laid include the attempted break and enter from S&S Liquor store in Airdrie, flight from police, possession of stolen property over and under \$5000.00, theft under \$5000.00, theft of motor vehicle, break and enter to a residence and added individual breaches. They are currently remanded in custody until their next court appearance.

Strathmore, Alberta - On March 25 2015 Strathmore RCMP received a call from a concerned member of the public, regarding the welfare of a male who had gone missing. RCMP members were able to locate the male on a rural property just east of Calgary on Highway 1. Once on scene, RCMP obtained further information that the person had been held inside a travel trailer against his will.

RCMP Secured the area and subsequently executed a search warrant on the property. Police recovered a stolen vehicle, multiple stolen items, and several firearms. RCMP are still at the scene continuing the search in relation to the stolen property.

The accused have been remanded in custody and are scheduled to appear in Calgary Provincial Court March 31st.

**Red Deer Public Safety Compliance Team checks drinking establishments**

On Friday, March 27, the Red Deer Public Safety Compliance Team (PSCT) paid unannounced visits to a number of drinking establishments in Red Deer to check for over-serving of alcohol, serving of underage patrons, fire code violations, and to ensure the establishments weren't exceeding their occupancy limits.

No issues were noted during these checks, and PSCT noted a number of improvements over their last unannounced visits. PSCT members commend the owners and managers of Red Deer drinking establishments for their continuing efforts to ensure their patrons' safety.

PSCT was formed in 2013 to address concerns related to drinking establishments in Red Deer. It is a partnership between Red Deer RCMP, Red Deer Emergency Services, Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission Red Deer Branch, City of Red Deer Inspections and Licensing and Alberta Health Services; PSCT focuses on prevention and enforcement, with the goals of improving the safety of staff and patrons, decreasing violence, and reducing the negative impact drinking establishments have on the community.

PSCT conducts unannounced inspections of Red Deer drinking establishments on a regular basis.

**RCMP arrest impaired driver after three collisions**

At approximately 1:40 pm on Sunday, Red Deer RCMP responded to a 911 call regarding a fight in progress in the parking lot of the Cheers pub in the Riverside Meadows neighbourhood, where one man was reported to have been stabbed. RCMP attended immediately along with Red Deer EMS.

The fight between two men began in an outdoor area across the street from the pub; one man was stabbed behind the ear with a broken glass object, at which point the altercation moved across the street into the parking lot. The two men were taken to hospital for treatment for minor injuries, after which the man accused of stabbing the victim was taken into police custody. The victim was released from hospital.

**RCMP Cochrane Investigate Interrupted Aggravated Assault**

This morning, at 8:39am, Cochrane RCMP were called to the underpass of Hermitage Road and Highway 1 where a witness travelling on Hermitage Road came upon two males who appeared to have had assaulted another male. The witness believed this male had been seriously assaulted and injured. The witness drove away to a safe location and called police. Once police arrived on scene forensic evidence indicative of a serious assault was located in the underpass of Hermitage Road and Highway 1 which is approximately 15 kilometers west of Cochrane. The victim of the assault and the males seen by the witness had departed and are believed to have headed east on Highway 1. Investigator's are looking for a grey 4 door car which was involved in this investigation.

**Rocky Mountain House RCMP – UPDATE #2: Investigate Stabbing at O’Chiese First Nation**

*Rocky Mountain House, Alberta* - A stabbing that took place at a house party on the O’Chiese First Nation early this morning occurred as a number of under-age house guests fought each other. During the altercation, a male youth aged 17 apparently stabbed another male youth, also 17. Two other houseguests received minor cuts and abrasions at the time, but neither they nor any other houseguest was involved in the stabbing. Only the victim of the stabbing is, at this time, known to have been a resident of the home where the injuries were sustained. However, all involved are believed to be residents of the O’Chiese First Nation.

The male victim is in hospital in Calgary where he is being treated for a non-life threatening wound. His mother, who was out of town at the time of the party, has been contacted by the RCMP and made aware of the injuries to her son and where he is being treated. The RCMP was on scene until 6:00 a.m. this morning continuing their investigation.

The 17-year-old male suspect, arrested at the scene by Rocky Mountain House RCMP remains in custody. Investigators continue to interview witnesses from the house party to determine the sequence of events leading up to the stabbing. The suspect will be brought before a Justice later this evening or early tomorrow morning to hear charges arising from this event and to have a judicial interim release hearing. The names of the suspect and victim will not be released in accordance the *Youth Criminal Justice Act*.

**RCMP Lay Charges Against Stoney First Nation Resident in Motor Vehicle Collision Against Her Spouse**

Cochrane RCMP have laid five charges against 38 year old, Brigitte Chiniquay, a residence of the Stoney First Nation after she intentionally ran over her common law spouse on the Stoney First Nation around 8:00pm on Monday, March 23, 2015. The charges are: Aggravated Assault, Fail to Remain at the Scene of a Collision, Driving while Disqualified, Impaired Driving Causing Bodily Harm and Criminal Negligence Causing Bodily Harm. Mrs. Chiniquay was remanded into custody for a bail hearing today at the Calgary Court Center via CCTV. Her common law spouse remains in hospital in serious but stable condition. The Cochrane RCMP General Investigation Section continues to investigate.

**Red Deer RCMP investigate armed robbery at Neighbours Petro Canada**

Red Deer RCMP are investigating an armed robbery that took place early this morning at the Neighbours Petro Canada located at 3330 50 Avenue, and are looking for public assistance to identify the armed man who entered the gas station and the second man who waited in a vehicle outside.

### RCMP Requesting Information On Daytime Break and Enter in Rural Area

*Airdrie, Alberta* – On March 23rd, 2015, at approximately 10:30 am, a citizen was travelling on Township Road 270 and noted two vehicles he did not recognize on the property of an elderly relative.

The citizen pulled into the property and approached the residence. Through the window the citizen could see an unknown male rummaging through cabinets.

The citizen got the unknown male's attention and an altercation ensued. A second male exited the residence and threatened the citizen with a screwdriver.

Both males departed quickly in one vehicle, leaving the second vehicle behind, driving west on Township Road 270.

The citizen then called RCMP. Airdrie Rural RCMP arrived and seized the abandoned vehicle. The second vehicle the suspects fled in was also later recovered.
