Multiple pharmaceutical drugs are believed to be the target of this break in, but nothing was taken in this instance.

RCMP Sundre Detachment – Single Vehicle Fatal Collision

Sundre, AB – On April 5, 2015 at approximately ten p.m., members of the Sundre RCMP detachment were dispatched to a single vehicle collision on highway 22 near township road 340.

On arrival at the scene, the vehicle appeared to have left the highway, rolled and came to a rest upright.

There were four occupants, two males and two females. One female passenger was ejected from the vehicle at the time of the collision, the female driver was unconscious and still within the vehicle. The two male passengers in the rear of the vehicle died at the scene. The female driver was transported by STARS air ambulance to a Calgary –area hospital, with the female passenger being transported by ground ambulance. Both are women are in stable condition.

The RCMP collision analyst from the Red Deer Traffic Services is assisting with the investigation.

Alcohol is believed to be a factor in the collision, and the investigation is ongoing at this time.

The names of the vehicle occupants are not being released at this time, and next of kin notifications are still pending.

Didsbury, AB – Pursuant to a stolen property investigation where the RCMP Emergency Response Team assisted with the arrest of one subject on April 2, 2015, one adult male has been charged with numerous Criminal Code offences.

32 year old Cory Delvin Freeborn, has been charged as follows:

- Fail to Comply with Recognizance,
- Theft of mail before delivery,
- Possession of mail,
- Possession of stolen property – 7 charges,
- Breach of firearms prohibition – 3 charges,
- Possession of a firearm, possession unauthorized,
- Possession of a prohibited firearm with readily accessible ammunition.

Freeborn has been remanded into custody, and his first appearance in Didsbury Provincial Court will be April 7, 2015.

UPDATE #4: (Charges) RCMP Cochrane Investigate March 29 Assault & Missing Person - Nick Lush

Cochrane, Alberta – RCMP have charged two Alberta men with the murder of Nicholas Lush, of Calgary, Alberta, who went missing in the early morning hours of March 29, 2015 after leaving a house party in the greater Calgary area.

Charged are:

- <!--• Cody Kenneth Bauer (24) of Calgary, Alberta with the First Degree murder of Nicholas Lush, and,
- Kristopher Goerzen (22) of Brooks, Alberta with the First Degree murder of Nicholas Lush.

Cody Kenneth Bauer is scheduled to appear in Cochrane Provincial Court on April 21, 2015, and Kristopher Goerzen is scheduled to appear in Cochrane Provincial Court on April 14, 2015.

Nicholas Lush's body has yet to be recovered and the RCMP continues in its efforts to locate his remains.

There are no further media updates planned until after the first appearances in court of Cody Kenneth Bauer and Kristopher Goerzen.
