RCMP Mayerthorpe - Missing – Misty Faith Potts - Update #1

Mayerthorpe, Alta. – Mayerthorpe RCMP are renewing their request for the public's assistance in locating 37-year-old Misty Faith Potts. Misty was last seen in **Enoch Cree Nation** on Saturday, March 14, 2015, and is believed to be travelling to Edmonton.

Misty is described as:

- 5' 6" tall
- 120-130 lbs
- dark brown, shoulder-length hair
- freckles on her face

Misty was last seen wearing:

- red jacket,
- coral-colored jeans,
- thick black-rimmed glasses

Misty was reported missing to Mayerthorpe RCMP on March 30 and all efforts to date locate her have been unsuccessful. The RCMP Missing Persons Unit, along with "K" Division General Investigation Section, are assisting with the investigation.

"If anyone has seen Misty, or knows of her whereabouts, we encourage them reach out to us," said Corporal Scott Potrebenko, Mayerthorpe RCMP, "We are very concerned for Misty and her well-being, and like her family, just want to be sure she is safe."

Redwater, Alberta - Redwater RCMP are continuing to investigate an armed robbery at a gas station on November 24, 2014. Police are seeking the public's assistance in identifying the men seen in video surveillance obtained from the scene.

On November 24th, 2014 at 8:20 PM a male entered the Husky gas station located at the Highway 28 and 63 Junction. The male was brandishing a knife and approached the clerk demanding money and left after receiving an amount of cash.

The suspect is described as:

- Black male -225-240 lbs
- 6 feet tall -Possibly bald or shaved head
- Thin facial hair on chin -Yellowing teeth
- Wearing dark sunglasses, black pants with a white stripe down the side and a Metal Mulisha sweatshirt.

Police are also looking to speak to a caucasian male seen in the store around the time of the robbery. He is described as:

- Caucasian male -200-215 lbs
- 6 feet tall -Thin dark beard
- Wearing a Sons of Anarchy sweatshirt, grey jeans and white Adidas shoes

No persons were harmed in this incident.

Red Deer RCMP arrest man for break and enter thanks to vigilant neighbours

Red Deer RCMP have arrested and charged a man for breaking and entering a home in the Anders neighbourhood, thanks to the vigilance of the victims' neighbours. The neighbours had a surveillance camera that captured the break and enter on video and led them to recognize the suspect as he walked through the neighbourhood a few days later.

The break and enter occurred during the day on April 11 when the homeowners were out; the suspect gained access by kicking in the garage door and then entering the house through the adjoining door. Once inside, the suspect stole cash, jewellery and passports. The passports were recovered on April 13.

On April 14, RCMP received a report that vigilant neighbours had spotted the suspect walking through the same neighbourhood and recognized him from their surveillance video. Police attended immediately and took the suspect into custody without incident; their subsequent investigation led to 35 year old Sean Aldridge being charged with Criminal Code 348(1)(b) – Breaking and entering.

Aldridge made his first court appearance on April 15 and will appear again at 9:30 am on April 22 for election and plea at Alberta Provincial Court in Red Deer.

“This is a great example of how getting to know your neighbours improves neighbourhood safety. Police can’t be everywhere, and we rely on citizens to be the eyes and ears,” says Corporal Leanne Molzahn of the Red Deer RCMP. “These neighbours knew their area and did a great job spotting a suspicious person and reporting it to the police, leading to an arrest and the laying of charges.”
