Break, Enter and Attempted theft of ATM

On February 10, 2016 RCMP were advised of an attempted theft of an ATM at the Smitty's in Olds, AB. Investigation determined that at about 03:15 A.M., a grey truck, believed to be a Dodge/RAM backed up to the door. Two subjects smashed the glass in the front entry. The males then proceeded to attach what looked to be a rope or tow strap to the ATM which was connected to the pick up truck. The culprits then attempted to pull the ATM from the entry with the truck however were unsuccessful. The culprits, having failed, left the scene. This attempt took only 3 minutes to commit. The investigation is continuing.

Update - Olds, AB Drug Bust January 21, 2016

Background:

Olds, AB: Olds RCMP & ALERT, Safer Communities and Neighbourhoods partnered in a drug investigation in the Town of Olds. Olds RCMP have charged a male for a number of offences following a drug search warrant in the Town of Olds. On Wednesday, January 21, 2016 shortly after midnight Olds RCMP executed a drug search warrant at a residence in Olds and located a quantity of illegal drugs. Olds RCMP have charged Chris Long 49 years of Olds, Ab with:

Traffic in Cocaine - 5(1) CDSA.
Possession for the Purpose (Cocaine) - 5(2) CDSA
Possession for the Purpose (Meth) - 5(2) CDSA
Possession for the Purpose (Heroin) - 5(2) CDSA
Possession for the Purpose (Marihuana) - 5(2) CDSA
Possession for the Purpose (Methylphenidate Prescription Pills) - 5(2) CDSA
Possession of Psilocybin - Mushrooms - 4(1) CDSA
Possession of Amphetamine Pills - 4(1) CDSA
Possession of Dihydromorphine Pills- 4(1) CDSA
Possession of Tetrahydrocannabinol Pills - 4(1) CDSA

UPDATE, 2015-02-11

On January 21, 2016 Mr. Christopher Long was charged with 10 drug related charges stemming from a vehicle stop and subsequent Search Warrant executed on his residence. Mr. Long was subsequently released on Five Thousand Dollar cash bail on his own recognizance by a Justice of the Peace. Pursuant to conditions of his release he is required to "SUBMIT TO RANDOM SEARCHES OF HIS PERSON, VEHICLE OR HOME BY A PEACE OFFICER.

Olds Detachment RCMP attended the residence of Christopher Long on 2016-02-11. A search pursuant to the conditions was conducted and a quantity of cocaine was found within the residence. Mr. Long has been charged with one count of Possession of a Controlled Substance (Cocaine), Section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act; and one count of Failing to Comply with Conditions of his Recognizance, Section 145(3) of the Criminal Code. Mr. Long is held in custody pending a release hearing in Provincial Court in Calgary on February 17, 2016.
