

## **Various Police Reports, Innisfail RCMP Detachment**

*November 4, 2016*

Here are a few things which occurred in our area within the past week. We continue to receive suspicious vehicle complaints from rural residents and we really appreciate the same.

On October 28, 2016 at approximately 9:30 pm, a lone male arrived at the hospital in Innisfail with three stab wounds. He stated that while he was walking down the alley near 42nd Street, three males who were dressed in black, ambushed him. A fight ensued and during the fight the victim was stabbed three times in the lower portion of his body. He was in close proximity to the Innisfail Hospital, so he was able to walk there under his own power. The three males are described as:

- 6'0-6'2 and skinny. He was Caucasian wearing all black clothes and had a black toque and mask on.
- 6'0 tall, 210 lbs with short dark hair. He was wearing a black coat with a hood and a black bandana to cover his face.
- 5'10, 200 lbs. He was wearing a tall black toque with the brim rolled up, a black neck warmer pulled up over his mouth and a black coat.

Innisfail RCMP continue to investigate the matter and are asking anyone with information in regards to the above noted event contact the Innisfail RCMP at (403) 227-3342.

On November 1, 2016 at approximately 3:00 pm, members of the Innisfail RCMP Detachment executed a search warrant at a residence on 44 street in the Town of Innisfail. As a result of the search warrant, a vehicle, a white 2001 Chevrolet Pickup Truck which had been stolen from Lacombe, was recovered. The vehicle was partially taken apart, and vehicle parts were found throughout the residence. Police also located a small amount of drugs and drug related paraphernalia.

A 24 year old female, of Innisfail, Alberta has since been charged with possession of stolen property over \$5000 and is set to attend court in Red Deer, Alberta on Friday December 9, 2016.

On October 28, 2016 at approximately 9:45 am, Innisfail RCMP received a report of counterfeit money which had been received by one of the local financial institutions. The counterfeit currency in this case was a \$20 dollar bill. This is a trend that has been continuing on a regular basis in Innisfail. Members of the general public and our local businesses are reminded to

remain diligent when handling cash. Many of the counterfeit bills have a different look and different feel than actual cash. It is important to look at each bill, to ensure the bill appears real, and to ensure the denomination on the holographic security feature actually matched the value of the bill. On July 7, 2016, Innisfail RCMP did arrest a Red Deer man who was in possession of over \$1700 worth of counterfeit Canadian cash, and the denominations included 20, 50 and 100 dollar bills. This trend continues to be a problem for business in Innisfail and surrounding areas.

On October 30, and November 1st, 2016, Innisfail RCMP received three reports of theft from motor vehicles, and three reports involving stolen vehicles. The thefts from the motor vehicles included some small personal items, small amounts of cash, and electronic equipment. In one instance welding cables were stolen from a work truck. The RCMP are encouraging people to ensure the following:

- Remove valuables from vehicles.
- Lock the doors.
- Remove keys including extra sets of keys.
- Refrain from leaving running vehicles unattended with the keys in the ignition.
- Continue to report any suspicious activity in the areas.
