

Sundre RCMP Report, February 1, 2016 – February 15, 2016

During this time period, RCMP Sundre received 76 calls for service. The following is a breakdown of some of those calls.

- Suspicious Person / Vehicle/ Property – 7
- Motor Vehicle Collisions – 7
- Mischief – 7
- Thefts – 7
- Break and Enters – 7
- Impaired – 5

The following summaries are matters that the RCMP Sundre detachment is either requesting public assistance or awareness.

On February 1, 2016, police received several complaints of a vehicle being operated in an erratic manner. Police were able to locate the vehicle and the driver. A 70 year old male from Bentley, AB was subsequently charged with Impaired Operation of a motor vehicle.

On February 12, 2016, police were called to assist Emergency Medical Services with an unresponsive male. The male was witnessed collapsing in a ditch on Hwy 22 near Sundre. Witnesses assisted the male with CPR until Emergency Services arrived. The 60 year old male was transported to hospital but unfortunately was declared deceased by natural causes. Police want to thank those that assisted the man with their valiant efforts to keep the male alive.

On the evening of February 12, 2016, police were called to a disturbance at the Sundre Arena. The Sundre Midget A Huskies hockey team were hosting the Rimbey Renegades for a hockey game. Unfortunately emotions were running high and several individuals became very disruptive where police were called to attend to bring order. Police are asking the public to call police immediately to deal with disruptive individuals that ruining the enjoyment of the hockey atmosphere. The Sundre detachment will be doing periodic patrols at the arena for future Midget games to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all who attend.

On February 12, 2016, a local Sundrite reported that he forgot his wallet on the counter at Joko's convenience store. A short stocky female with brown hair, wearing a red jacket or sweater, blue jeans and sneakers was caught on security footage swiping the wallet from the counter and pocketing it. The thief left the store and got into a grey colored SUV. Police are requesting the public's assistance with identifying the thief. If anyone has

RCMP Sundre Detachment has received numerous complaints about a scam where the recipient has received a phone call, voice mail, email message, letter or text message identifying themselves as the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA). The scam claims to be from the CRA requesting personal information such as social insurance number, credit card number, bank account number or passport number. These scams insist that this personal information is required so that the taxpayer can receive a refund or benefit payment.

Cases of fraudulent communication has also involved threatening or coercive language to scare individuals into paying fictitious debt to the CRA or face arrest by the police. Other communications urge the recipient to visit a fake CRA website via a link where personal information is requested to verify their identity.

Police are advising the public that these are scams and that the recipient should never respond to these fraudulent communications or click on the links provided.
