

## **Sundre RCMP Report – November 17, 2016**

On November 15, 2016, RCMP Sundre received several reports of stolen motor vehicles within the town of Sundre. After receiving the reports, police were able to determine the following. Around 10 pm on November 14, 2016, a light grey 2007 Nissan Sentra was stolen from a store in the Sylvan Lake area. This vehicle was used to cart the cowardly thieves to Sundre a few hours later, where they proceeded to victimize the Sundre residents by stealing their hard earned vehicles. The thieves had also made attempts on several other vehicles but were unsuccessful. The vehicles of choice for these bums are 2000 to 2012 Ford F 350s, where the thieves would punch the lock from the passenger side of the vehicle, enter the vehicle, punch the ignition, then drive off in the victim's vehicle.

The Nissan was recovered North of Sundre on Township Road 334 where it was dumped after the cowards made off with their stolen loot. The stolen vehicles are described as followed:

- White 2004 Ford F350 crew cab with gold trim and western decals, black racing wheels with Nitto, Trail Grappler tires, Alberta Licence Plate RTE727. The vehicle was stolen from 10th Avenue NE while it was parked in front of the victim's residence.
- Grey 2002 Ford F350 dually extended cab with Alberta licence plate BTT4919. The vehicle was stolen from the Sundre Forest Products parking lot.
- Vehicle thefts of the same type of vehicle were attempted at the following locations:
  - Front and rear parking lot of the apartment block on 503 - 6th Street South West.
  - Outside a residence on 2nd Street NE near 12 Avenue.

Please be vigilant for yourself but also your neighbour. The thieves prey off your complacency so please remove all valuables, garage door openers, and, extra keys from your vehicles.

Please report any suspicious activity to the RCMP Sundre detachment, immediately. Should you see a crime in progress, in the interest of your safety, our office strongly dissuades you from confronting the criminals. Call 911 immediately and supply as much information as you can such as make, model, licence plate of vehicle, suspect descriptions, direction of travel, time it occurred plus your information so that the officers can contact you for follow up.
